Video Recording	 The video must be recorded at the same venue. The video must be recorded at the same camera angle. The video must show all performers' whole body with their instruments. Each piece must be recorded in oneRequired take without edit. Accompaniment: Performance by all instrumentalists together will be recommended. However, due to pandemic, students may play and record their performance with pre-recorded accompaniment (including midi file).

	 The works should be in different styles. The works may be designed by classical instruments, contemporary instruments and any type of digital sounds. One work should be the students' original work. Arrangements for already published music will be acceptable, but it must include students' own engineering technique. Work for video (short film and advertisement) will be acceptable. Recording files (audio or video) should be submitted.
