"STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL"

REFUND POLICIES

In order to ensure that students are fully informed of their irghts and the procedures for obtainingh tuition refunds, a copy of the university's Cancellation/Withdrawal, and refund policies is given to students when they register. In compliance with the California Education Code, the university's cancellation, withdrawal, and refund policies are disclosed on the reverse side of the enrollment agreement

1. Full Refund

If the scheduled classes are canceled by the university, students will receive a full refund. To request a cancellation and refund, a student must hand-deliver a request in writing to the school administrator. The student will soon after receive a response from the school administrator.

2. CAU Federal and State Student Financial Aids Refund Policy
